

Smoking Policy

EYFS 2021 Smoke Free Legislation

Purpose

This policy has been developed to protect all staff, children and visitors from exposure to secondhand smoke. Exposure to secondhand smoke increases the risk of lung cancer, heart disease and other serious illnesses.

Policy

It is the policy of Alamiyah School that all areas within our school and on the school's outdoor premises are smoke free, and all staff have a right to work in a smoke free environment. any form of smoking including conventional cigarettes, pipes, e-cigarettes and vaping are all prohibited on all premises in the workplace. This policy applies to all staff, trainees, consultants, parents and visitors.

Implementation

Overall responsibility for policy implementation and review rests with the Headteacher. However, all staff are obliged to adhere to, and support the implementation of the policy. The Headteacher shall inform all staff and visitors of the policy and their role in the implementation and monitoring of the policy.

Non-Compliance

Local disciplinary procedures will be followed if a member of staff does not comply with this policy. Those who do not comply with the smoke free law may also be liable to a fixed penalty fine and possible criminal prosecution.
